Paul Forman commented: Some landlords are not in favor of PBID formation.

- iii. **Executive Director Report** Blair reported: Pursuing revenue streams with the help of Commune Communication, Commune will develop outreach materials to our membership and businesses along Orange and Wardlow for possible expansion; Able Arts Work has moved into the north gallery; meeting with grant writer Tom Peters to discuss fundraising; Atlantic Avenue "Street Closure Pilot Program" has been cleared off the streets, no more equipment; rogue operation at Orange and Carson, illegal restaurant and COVID testing site reported to city departments; potential illegal cat shelter at 4204 Atlantic Avenue, also reported to city departments; member outreach last week asking members for their priorities in 2022; letter to members will go out regarding the next Business Breakfast; January's focus has been on admin and housekeeping for BKBIA issues; looking to change landscape company that would be more responsive; BK Centre for Innovation and Arts project, helping Yanki Greenspan to change the use of the church at 345 Carson so the orthodox community can move there in a year. We are making introductions to artists to use the space on a one-year basis.

Executive Director's Report – February 24, 2022

• Pursuing the revenue streams per August board meeting – update:

 Commune Communication has received feedback on both collateral pieces and will send over a second draft. Discussion to follow later in meeting.

COBA meeting with city managers

- Shared feedback from all BIDs regarding lack of responsiveness from many city departments that the BIDs rely on.
- City hall has had a minimum of 20% attrition and many departments are extremely short staffed at the moment (national trend is 50% of public employees have left their jobs)
 - John Keisler, Director of Economic Development will be leaving the city on March 31
- o CM will remind departments of the importance of BIDs and to be more responsive; will look into specific incidents we discussed
- Requested a current "contact" list of who we can reach out to besides department directors.

• Security/Safety Issues:

- Met with LBPD and CSI to discuss current
 - LBPD Last 30 days saw an uptick in burglary and larceny. It is critical that: 1. Dispatch is called to report any incident, and 2. A business protects itself with plenty of lighting, security cameras, and keeping all tablets and cash put away
 - Suspecting it an "inside job" to the two break-ins at Steelcraft last month
 - LBPD suggests reporting homeless issues to Homeless Services for officers and staff to come make evaluations
 - CSI making contact with the homeless; busy with calls from business members, still patrolling area day/night
 - BKBIA/Members: Need to be willing to participate in asking someone to move off property before calling CSI to handle everything
- Cat Shelter status
 - With the help from Friends of LB Animals, the cats are being removed to get spayed and neutered, then finding homes
 - Inside is a hoarding situation
 - Upstairs business tenants are moving out due to the smell
 - Issue has been reported to several city departments

• Member Outreach

- o Daily outreach to individual members
- Will focus on the beauty sector in first round of our federal grant funds—these are businesses who had been hit the hardest during the COVID-19 shutdowns

• Misc. Notes

- o My main focus has been the recovery act grant fund application; bridge funding projects; discussions with grant writer
- o Annual Meeting moved to March, combined with a members-only breakfast.
