Council Reports:

Kyle Henneberque, CD5 – Learning the area now; attended First Fridays; will share the field office space with CD8

Sean Bernhoft, CD7 - 79.2% of the city residents have at least one sot; boosters are available now; Cal Trans will be cleaning up the encampment at 405 and Pacific; The Adopt-A-Highway is a good one to consider for the BKBIA or other organizations; Daisy Lane Parade is set for December 11, organized by the BKBIA; this will be the last meeting that CD7 now that redistricting will take effect.

Board members thanked Sean for his work and contribution to the BKBIA.

Agenda:

a. Presentation: Eric Romero, City of Long Beach: Use of one-time funds

- Eric reported: City council approved a one-time funding of the BKBIA of \$200,000, to help replace the lost RDA funds; city also paid for the PUMA strategic plan; This funding is intended to help the BKBIA plan for the future; the agreement has been sent to the BKBIA to review and sign
- ii. Funds may be used to hire consultants to pursue the PBID option (start to finish with the plan), approximately \$40K to \$60K; compensate staff and contractors for outreach to expand boundaries; hire consultants to study other revenue generation ideas (new events to raise revenues); Development fundraising and board development for the BK Community Foundation 501c3; funds may be used to hire consultants for communicating strategies to membership and landlords
- iii. 10% may be used for bookkeeping and any admin fees
- iv. BKBIA needs to sign the agreement, pursue consultants, bill the city for expenses; 50K can be advanced once agreement is signed.

b. Committee Reports:

- i. Project Manager Report Myra reported: Working on the new "nonprofit support project" via the 50K anonymous donation; Business Features continue to introduce businesses of all sectors to the community; Sarah Downs has helped us as an intern via CD8, helping to clean up our membership list and mailing list; creating of an Expo Arts Center calendar so the tenants can add their dates and avoid conflicts for booking events and meetings; Knights of the Round (Turn)Table in November had a great turnout at The Pan; Kidical Mass December 19 is our "Ugly Sweater Ride"; Social Media statistics: Instagram 20,838 followers; Facebook 19,112 followers + 8,090 in BK Community Group; constantly posting on social media for community engagement
- ii. Security & Code Enforcement Included in E.D. Report
- iii. Executive Director Report Blair reported: Pursuing revenue streams with the help of Commune Communication, Commune will develop outreach materials to our membership and businesses along Orange and Wardlow for possible expansion; Daisy Lane Parade is all set for this Saturday and BKBIA will be paid for its services; Arts & Services (Able Arts) for the Disabled will be moving into the Expo building, north gallery; Survey sent to businesses and community regarding the Atlantic Avenue Open Streets lane closure, feedback will be sent to the city's traffic engineer; Met with CSI Patrol Service to request patrols to be reinstated back to normal, especially through the end of the year; potential

illegal cat shelter at 4204 Atlantic Avenue, this has been reported to LBPD, Business Licensing, Health Department and Animal Care Services; other notes included acknowledgement of Care Closet LB for its cleanups around the district and Kevin being our Clean Team member; BKBIA will shut down during the week between Christmas and New Year's. Business Breakfast scheduled in January; Annual Meeting scheduled in February; Thank you to Crystal Rogers for being our bartender at First Fridays.

Executive Director's Report – January 27, 2022

- Pursuing the revenue streams per August board meeting update:
 - City is late with assessment checks which is an issue; they will be late with the next check it appears, too.
 - Commune Communication. They are finishing up the "messaging" for our 1. Outreach to members about increase in assessment fees, and 2. Expansion efforts to Orange Avenue.
 - Commune had actually created a piece better served for the expansion piece; now finishing the notice to members about fee increase
 - New tenant for Expo Able Arts Moved in; has lease, paying rent.
 - New leases for current tenants with increased rent
 - Bill Larson working on this
 - Meeting with Tom Peters, grant writer, after February 1 to discuss the pursuit of grants and donations to the BK Community Foundation
- Atlantic Avenue "street closure pilot program"
 - All barricades and equipment have been removed.
 - Diagonal parking on west side of the street has been removed.
- Security/Safety Issues:
 - Repeat offender off of Linden and Roosevelt
 - Neighbors have reported a man breaking into backyards and garages; same guy doing it repeatedly; we will be contacting LBPD about this
 - Rogue operation at Orange Avenue & Carson
 - Illegal pop-up events at former thrift store location in that shopping center; 150 motorcycles on a Saturday night racing up and down Orange and into the neighborhood
 - Illegal Covid-19 testing with BBQ out front, too
 - Reported from residents and to CD5, LBPD, Business Licensing, Health Department, and Code Enforcement
 - Potential illegal cat shelter at 4204 Atlantic Avenue
 - No business license has been issued to that location
 - Getting mixed information from building tenants and property manager; no enforcement from the city yet
