Committee Reports:

- **Project Manager Report** Myra reported: First Salsa Dance Night at Taboon was a success with 30+ in attendance, we received great feedback; First Fridays "County Fair" was success despite the cold and wind, especially the Khmer New Year celebration; great feedback from our first "Day in Bixby" video with over 12,000 views. We will continue to create more; our first Business of Distinction program was awarded to A Barber Shop on LB Blvd on their 55th anniversary, our goal is to do 1-2 a month to honor those with long tenure in the district; LB Walking Club coming to Bixby Knolls for a "women's walk" with estimated over 100+ attendees. A great way to show new people the district
- Executive Director Report Blair reported: BKBIA is now at full strength with Alana on staff; next business breakfast is May 16; working on the summer parking lot concert series; Security note Jimmy Clemons is the number one offender in the district and we are building a case for LBPD for an arrest. He continues to harass the businesses in the area; we booked a daytime guard for CVS center at 35th and Atlantic as a deterrent; still waiting on city's one-time grant funds; Kelly Bray is assisting with lighting projects on the corridors; additional security at First Fridays helped to keep things calm and family-friendly.

Council Reports:

- Council District 5: Robert Allarte discussed: Please use the GoLongBeach app to report any issues around the district/neighborhood; CD5 will be hosting the Strollers at the field office; Level Up LB Grant info just was shared and should go to our membership; Councilwoman Kerr is headed to Washington DC with the mayor to discuss small plane noise among other things. General discussion ensued regarding general aviation, more air traffic.

First Fridays

July First Fridays: "Block Party" theme to go with the holiday weekend, slow start but then got really busy by 7:30pm when we hosted our "Olympic Torch Run," which everyone seemed to have enjoyed the spontaneous parade.

Long Beach Walking Club x BKBIA

- June 9th we hosted the LBWC and had around 200 ladies attend the event.
- Our goal with this event was to bring a new crowd to the district, introduce them to the area and to new businesses to discover in hopes they continue to return.
- Huge success, we had GOfetch and Mystic Massage table at start/end plus Five Starr Pilates, Lucy's Boudoir & The Merchant host us with treats. Steelcraft eateries provided 10%-off for lunch after the event.
- We will try to host them again in the fall with a different route and different business stops/features.

Coffee Crawl Video Promotion

- Our 6-part video series of our "Coffee Crawl in Bixby Knolls" is now live on Instagram Reels & FB. We have received great response so far on social media.
- The first video has 10.5K views & second video has 18K view so far, total views combined are at 38K views (calculated July 10th morning)
- We did 13 stops including Eis Pub at the end for an Irish Coffee.
 - Other stops include Sala Coffee & Wine, The Merchant, Rad Coffee, Sweetgrass, Cassidy's, CoffeeDrunk, Steelhead Coffee, Bixby Joe, Nonna Mercato, Philz, Coffee Bean, Starbucks

New Content Direction

- We now have a TikTok account @bixbyknolls, which we will start to post our "destination" video-based content. This will help us highlight BK as a go-to spot for business recommendations and things to do.
- Our next "Day in Bixby Knolls" video feature will be "Night Edition" to highlight Nonna Mercato's "Summer Nights" dinner service, Long Beach Shakespeare Company, and a couple other "night life" businesses.
- We recently have partnered with a small influencer/content creator
 "@cutelittlespots_" which helped promote Tony's Kitchen brunch. The video got over 226K views and has helped them get busier since it went live.
- We will explore other influencer/content creation partnerships to continue helping businesses and the overall district gain new exposure and promotion.

To help with the workload, we have been working with Diana to help us edit videos as we continue to work on our ongoing programs and day-to-day responsibilities. This has really helped us grow our content output.

BK Community Foundation

- We hosted our "Taylor Swift Social Party" Event Fundraiser, sold 170 tickets, fundraised \$6,900 with tickets and bar sales. We had Pixie Toys, Art Spot, Glasshouse Hair Salon and Able Arts Works participate at the event.

Executive Director's Report – (May 30, 2024) July 11, 2024

• General News:

- We have booked our 4 parking lot concerts, June thru August AND have one additional to add to the schedule which will be combined with First Fridays in August. FYI: The August 12 concert is sponsored by CD8 and will be held in the Bixby Knolls Shopping Center area
- Clean & Safe Efforts: Tom Underhill has worked exceptionally hard in the last month cleaning tree wells and filling with mulch; reporting graffiti and removing/painting over tags when possible, tree trimming and lots of litter removal. Kelly Bray continues his outreach to landlords for safety issues such as lighting, graffiti, and encampments
 - We have power-washed a number of locations along Atlantic really needing a cleaning, especially by Somi Somi
- o Knolls Shopping Center landlord has complained about a food truck setting up daily on the sidewalk along LB Blvd in front of Trader Joe's. They are most concerned with the effect it has on Blue Burro. We contact the health department and business licensing to see if this operator is permitted and licensed or not and what enforcement the city can do to move the truck to somewhere else. Same goes for the fruit cart set up in the same location. (Update: Health and Licensing departments have addressed this. Now we have a few vendors popping up at the 7-11 property line)

o Business of Distinction program:

General Safety Notes

- O UPATE: We received the funds finally (\$29K); need to meet with Dennis Cook to create a plan for additional over-night coverage.
 - One-time funding (for security) from the city: Still waiting for these funds to arrive since their approval on October 1. Just last week another curve was thrown at us; the city asking for updated certificates of insurance and workers comp (which was no big deal), but then asking for "crime prevention" insurance which could cost us \$3000-\$4000/year to carry. Makes no sense. I wrote back asking why NOW after all this time was this sent to us and not brought up 8 months ago.
- o **UPDATE:** Jimmy has been out of the district for over five weeks now. All quiet from him.
 - Jimmy Clemons remains the number one offender in the district although he's been quiet the last few days. LBPD has been notified of all incidents caused by him; hoping there's a big enough case to have him locked up.
- o "Ronnie" was released from county jail, skipped his required rehab and now seems to be sleeping alongside of Polly's for the last few days. Homeless Services has been contacted for outreach. Care Closet cleaned up his debris behind Rad Coffee. He remains against the wall at Polly's Pies.
- Sick trees on Cartagena Lola's reported sick trees dripping sticky residue alongside their space on Cartagena. CD5 reported this to Public Works. A few years ago there was a bad tree infestation in the area and we hope this hasn't happened again. More trees around the district may be sick with infestation now.

BK Community Foundation

- UPDATE: Status is all current. We will contact our bookkeeper and CPA for current year tax filing.
- Sent all paperwork to the DOJ and state to ensure the status remains "good."
- o All taxes have been filed.
- We have someone in the neighborhood who would like to get more involved with the Foundation to help us with fundraising and addressing issues in the neighborhood. We will pursue this to see exactly how much this individual wants to help and relieve some of the pressure from the BKBIA in managing the non-profit.

Expo Building

- o In the works with the city: solar paneling, new lighting in Main Room, new carpet in Main Room. All of this is slow-going and dates for installation will be coordinated to not affect any programming. Had another meeting to discuss lighting project. Need to coordinate efforts for installation of solar panels, then lighting, and lastly carpet.
- There is a change in city staff as our point of contact for minor repairs. We have had some issues recently with the toilets
